Following the success of the previous two years, the third **European Vocational Skills Week** will run from **5-9 November 2018**. Key events and activities will take place in **Vienna**this year, organised in close cooperation with the Austrian Presidency of the Council of the
EU. A variety of national opening events will also be held in other EU Member States, along
with hundreds of VET-related events and activities at local and regional level.
