Jobs, Skills & the European Green Deal

New Cedefop report forecasts which sectors, occupations and skills will be impacted by the Green Transition



According to the **Green Employment and Skills Transformation** report published in December 2021 by the European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (Cedefop), implementing the **European Green Deal (EGD)** will have profound effects across sectors, at various intensities and directions:



In most sectors, these changes will be moderately positive in terms of employment, while a few sectors will lose more jobs than they will gain.



Overall, the implementation of the EGD will create up to 2.5 million additional jobs in the EU by 2030.



Some of the sectors expected to benefit most in terms of employment include water supply and waste management, utilities and electricity supply and construction.

For instance, "constructing energy-efficient buildings will require workers to be more aware of eco-friendly materials and technologies," notes the report."



Other sectors will see a redirection of employment towards cleaner production rather than an employment increase or decrease.



New occupations will also arise in the future green economy, such as creators of new green and sustainable products.
