WELCOME BY NICOLAS SCHMIT, EU COMMISSIONER FOR JOBS AND SOCIAL RIGHTS



By informing people of the opportunities VET provides, the initiative aims to ensure social fairness and contribute to making the first principle of the **European Pillar of Social Rights** on equal access to quality and inclusive education, training, and lifelong learning a reality on the ground.

I take this opportunity to thank all the VET community that have made the VET Excellence Awards' celebration a success through the years.

Celebrating the first 6 editions of the VET **Excellence Awards**, this album provides a snapshot of the highlights of the flagship VET event that takes place in the context of the European Vocational Skills Week.

Since their launch, the Awards have seen many changes, reflecting the changing nature of VET and society, such as in 2018 when the Awards voting went online to facilitate more public involvement, or later in 2020 when the Covid pandemic struck and the Awards ceremony itself, alongside the Week, had to be held online, as was the 2022 edition.

WHY VET EXCELLENCE AWARDS?

The Awards aim to **highlight best practices** in VET all over Europe by recognising VET Excellence practitioners for their **talent**, **passion**, and **commitment**, and, in so doing, **inspire** others to follow in their footsteps.

Since their inception in 2016, the VET Excellence Awards have become a real focal point for the VET industry, fostering closer cooperation and the exchange of ideas as academia, industry, and policymakers, as well as the European Commission gather to recognise best practices.

Several of the awards are organised by external entities; however, the Commission consistently oversees the management of the process and the final Awards ceremony.

Each year usually features a guest of honour, who is not part of the online voting but has won an international skills event, such as the EuroSkills event organised by WorldSkills Europe.

Some years also feature Special Mentions, such as in 2022 when Ukraine was recognised for its participation in the GRETA project and for reforming its education and training systems, working alongside the European Training Foundation.

Through the years, the VET Excellence Awards have succeeded not just in recognising excellence in VET, but also in showcasing the attractiveness of VET to a wider audience – one of the aims of the **European Vocational Skills Week**.

Particularly in times of change, VET offers alternatives for all those who seek to reskill, upskill, or change their life and career direction, providing varied choices for a more fulfilling professional and social life.



WHO IS AWARDED?

The Awards showcase excellent practices among **VET stakeholders** – including **teachers, students, schools, companies, organisations and other VET-related practitioners**.





WHAT ARE THE AWARD CATEGORIES?

There are several award categories with subcategories reflecting the diversity of providers and VET learners. However, these categories vary depending on the year, as do the number of nominees and winners. In case of *ex aequo* results, there are three pre-selected candidates.

Companies and Learners awards

These awards aim to give visibility to good practices for career-long professional learning in enterprises, as well as to apprentices and companies under the **European Alliance for Apprenticeships (EAFA)**.

VET Innovators

- **Innovative VET Provider** aims to identify a European VET provider that has contributed to VET excellence through innovative practices. It is organised by the European Commission in cooperation with the expert group **Platform of European Associations of VET Providers**.
- **VET Researcher** aims to award researchers who are making an outstanding contribution to VET research in a specific field, which varies depending on the year.
- The Entrepreneurial School Award (TES), Junior Achievement (JA) Europe aims to encourage vocational and academic schools to put more emphasis on teaching entrepreneurial skills as a way to better prepare young people for the jobs of tomorrow. The European Commission has invited JA Europe to participate in the TES Awards by recognising outstanding VET secondary schools.

European Funding for Excellence in VET

- European Social Fund (ESF/ESF+) awarded projects aim to give visibility to excellent ESF practices in the areas of VET and skills development that make people more competitive in the labour market while ensuring fairness. Each year the award has a different thematic focus. This is a closed competition managed by the European Commission in cooperation with the Managing Authorities of the European Social Fund.
- <u>Erasmus+</u> awards draw public attention to the Erasmus+ programme's success stories within projects focusing on particular themes. This is a closed competition managed by the European Commission in cooperation with the Erasmus+ National Agencies.

European Agencies Awards

- #CedefopPhotoAward aims to mobilise VET learners to showcase what VET means to them through a series of photos and/or video. Teams of vocational learners from across Europe take part with a photo story and/or a video clip, sharing their stories on the theme for that specific year. The two winning photo stories are then put to an online public vote for the top prize, which is announced at the VET Excellence Awards ceremony.
- The European Training Foundation (ETF) showcases examples of excellent VET practices on different themes, depending on the year. The aim is to provide policymakers and practitioners in the EU neighbourhood and beyond with inspiration and ideas for VET.

Celebrating excellent practices in VET for a 6th edition, the 2022 Awards recognised a variety of stakeholders from learners to teachers and trainers, companies, organisations, and others linked to VET.

The European Commission organised the flagship event, held online due to COVID-19 restrictions. The celebratory virtual Awards ceremony was an opportunity to highlight the nominees' remarkable achievements and showcase their unique talents. European Commission Vice-President for Promoting our European Way of Life Margaritis Schinas alongside EU Commissioner for Jobs and Social Rights Nicolas Schmit announced most of the Award winners. The director of Cedefop Jurgen Siebel and ETF director Xavier Matheu announced the respective winners for their awards. The Awards ceremony was held on 18 May during the 2022 European Vocational Skills Week. The 2022 Week's edition (16-20 May 2022) had a particular focus on the theme VET & the Green Transition, reflecting the European Commission's priorities for a European Green Deal towards a climate-neutral Europe by 2050, while showcasing the skills needed for the green transition.

The flagship Awards ceremony, alongside the rest of the Week's events (9-13 November 2020), was held online due to pandemic-related restrictions that did not allow the hosting of the event in Berlin, Germany as originally planned.

The Awards' focus was on the theme of the 2020 European Vocational Skills Week **VET for Green and Digital Transitions**, in line with the Commission's priorities for a climate-neutral Europe as outlined in the <u>European Green Deal</u> and <u>A Europe fit for the digital age</u>.



Building on the success of the 1st edition in 2016, the 2nd edition of the European Vocational Skills Week (the Week) returned triumphantly on 20-24 November 2017, organised by the European Commission in cooperation with the Estonian Presidency of the Council of the European Union.
