Introduction

This conference is organised by the Finnish 2019 EU Presidency and connected with the European 2019 Skills Week. It brings focus to lifelong guidance as a transversal policy area in response to the current debate of the demographic challenges, technological changes, future of work, globalisation and sustainable development. The conference follows up the recommendations from previous EU interventions and lifelong guidance policy conferences and identifies key principles of effective and relevant lifelong guidance services. The purpose of this conference is to identify potential, relevant EU interventions in repositioning and transforming lifelong guidance in the post EU2020 policies.

Discussion questions

The EU member states are facing major challenges with the changing labour market and new forms of work. Careers are becoming increasingly multidirectional as individuals change jobs more frequently and learn new skills in response to technological developments. Given the diversity of lifelong guidance services in different sectors, settings, funding mechanisms and changing needs of the individuals, this conference explores:

- How lifelong guidance could be repositioned across the policy fields at national and EU levels, in particular taking into account the future of work and in preparing citizens for new forms of employment, underemployment or no employment in a segmented labour market:
- How to establish and spread the most efficient ways of lifelong guidance to battle skills gap in Europe, fulfil the employment and career potential of every individual and encourage individuals and businesses to innovation and growth through upskilling and meaningful work;
- How to facilitate strategic leadership and cooperation of lifelong guidance activities and systems;
- How to take advantage of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) as a means of policy and systems partnership and of joint action by the partners for the benefit of citizens?

Thematic focus and working methodology

In addition to a plenary, which will set the scene, structured table discussions sessions will focus on particular aspects of the overall challenges presented above.
