European Commission President announces 2023 as the European Year of Skills!



During her annual <u>State of the European Union address</u> on 14 September, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen shared her vision on the future of the EU, outlining the initiatives the Commission plans to take next year in key areas, including announcing 2023 as the European Year of Skills.



The **#2023 European Year of Skills** will focus on working together to promote concrete skills actions to boost the competitiveness of European companies, in particular SMEs, and to realise the full potential of the digital and green transformation in a socially fair and just manner. It should promote skills policies and investments to address labour shortages and build a better skilled and more adaptable workforce in the EU. The Year will also give a boost to the **European Pillar of Social Rights Action Plan** targets of a 78% employment rate and of 60% of adults participating in upskilling and reskilling each year by 2030.

European Commission adopts **European Care Strategy**, highlights need for new skills for caregivers


Care is a large economic sector, employing 9.1 million people across the Union. Driven by the needs of an ageing population, the sector has an **untapped job creation potential** that will further increase in the future. **Skills requirements in the care sector are increasingly complex**, with a strong need for soft skills, digital skills, and specific competences (for instance, knowledge of geriatric care or care for people with Alzheimer's).

The <u>European Care Strategy</u> highlights how upskilling and reskilling opportunities will improve the attractiveness and quality of care work. EU-level supporting actions include <u>ERASMUS+</u> support for early childhood education and care (ECEC) staff to continuously develop their professional competences, a skills partnership under the <u>Pact for Skills</u> for the long-term care sector, action on digital skills in the health and care sectors under the <u>Digital Europe Programme</u>, as well as gathering skills intelligence on current and future skills needs and trends in the long-term care sector.

The **proposal for a Council recommendation on access to high-quality affordable long-term care** invites Member States to address skills needs and worker shortages in long-term care, in collaboration with social partners. These include designing and improving initial and continuous education and training, as well as building career pathways in the long-term care sector through upskilling, reskilling, skills validation, and information and guidance services.


- The Conference revolves around four themes:

2022 Forum on **Vocational Excellence** in Spain

The **2022 Forum on Vocational Excellence** will take place in San Sebastian, Autonomous Community of the Basque Country, Spain, on **15 and 16 November**. The Forum will discuss the latest developments on the European initiative on **Centres of Vocational Excellence (CoVEs)**. The event is jointly organised by the European Commission and the Basque government, with the support of the **European** Training Foundation (ETF), Cedefop and EACEA, as well as the Community of Practice on CoVEs, and *Katapult*. It will include the participation of the partners of ongoing CoVE projects, as well as other Vocational Excellence initiatives currently being developed in Europe and beyond, that form part of wider partnerships and networks in Vocational Education and Training (VET). The event will also benefit from high-level political representatives, including national governments (from EU and ETF partner countries), social partners and their European level representatives, VET provider associations, regional authorities, International organisations, as well as European institutions and agencies.
